

208-2 RM-B confirmed that Megan Tanner, who is a National Trust property manager in charge of 3 NT properties, has agreed to provide a talk at the AGM on the Topic of The Red House, Bexley.

208-3 A duty roster for the AGM was completed, SB to Purchase the necessary refreshments and AC to source the raffle prizes. JC and MH offered to handle refreshments on the night. RM-B will check with Ray Andrew re opening up and locking up afterwards as well as checking the availability of the necessary AV equipment.

208-4 RB advised that he had updated the MHS and MFAS details for the AGM Notice and RM-B agreed to check the Concert Band dates. It was agreed to include an appeal for Road Stewards especially for the flats to which we have difficulty gaining access. JC agreed to approach one resident of Evans Court whom she knows. It was also agreed to include a brief report on the subject of Primary Education in the Village area and a request for residents to consider a wish list for improvements to the Village so that we can respond quickly should funds become available.

MRA 16-209 DRIS

A brief discussion took place on the subject of Primary Education in North Mottingham and Committee Members were updated on the background and current proposals for Dorset Rd Infant School. LK advised that she will be attending a meeting with the New Schools Network on March 29th and RMB and RB agreed to accompany her if they can. It was also agreed that a brief note on the current situation as we understand it should be included in the AGM Notice with an undertaking to consult with residents as soon as we have more information.

MRA 16-210 PORCUPINE PUB

RB advised that although Lidl had indicated they would have news for us in Mid-March, as yet we have heard nothing further. One Resident has reported an interest by Antic Pub Group and Lidl's contact details have been passed on. It was however noted that Antic had shown no interest when approached previously.

MRA 16-211 CHAIR'S REPORT

RMB advised that he has had a series of meetings with Eltham College regarding the website but after initial enthusiasm progress has been disappointing, probably due to the approaching examinations.

MRA 16-212 REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS

212-1 Bromley Police

In the absence of Police Representatives LK gave a brief summary of recent crime statistics from the Police newsletter recently circulated. The highest incidences were in the areas of Burglary/Theft, ABH/GBH, Criminal Damage and theft from or damage to Vehicles.

212-2 Greenwich Police

No report was available.

212-3 Bromley Residents' Federation

RH was attending a meeting this evening hence his apologies for absence. As the BRF's meetings frequently clash with Executive Committee meetings RH has decided not to stand again for the Executive Committee although he will continue to represent the MRA on the Bromley Resident's Federation.

212-4 Planning – Bromley

The subject of the Telephone Mast and Eltham College's application for an alcohol licence are covered under 206-4 above. Eltham College have also submitted an application for permission to erect temporary classrooms whilst some buildings are being rebuilt. This has provoked serious objections from some residents in Mottingham Lane.

212-5 Planning Greenwich

The only significant planning application appearing on Greenwich's website relates to 38 Chapel Farm Rd and we understand this has been refused. LK advised that she was aware of a further application relating to 35 Hartsmead although no details are yet available.

212-6 The Festive Lights Committee

RB confirmed that a meeting of the FLC had changed the bank signatories and that accounts had been passed to Bernie Hawes for auditing prior to his holiday in April. A copy of the final Income and Expenditure account for 2015-6 is attached to these Minutes as a record.

RB also advised that SB had suggested making the lights more of an event involving the Concert Band and Mottingham Choir and perhaps a small Farmer's Market. SB is investigating.

MRA 16-213 TREASURER'S REPORT

A copy of the accounts had been circulated prior to the meeting and a copy is attached to these Minutes as a record. In the absence of Bernie Hawes on holiday these will be audited by Les Huxley in time for the AGM.

MRA 16-214 MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY'S REPORT

Latest membership figures were circulated prior to the meeting and a copy is attached to these minutes as a record. More Road Stewards are needed as some existing Stewards, notably MH, were covering very large areas. RM-B advised that he knows of one potential candidate.

MRA-16-215 LOCAL ISSUES AND MEMBER'S CONCERNS

SB reported problems being caused by motorcyclists in the Dunkery Road area and RY noted similar behaviour by a small group of young cyclists racing about at night without lights.

MRA-16-216 ANY OTHER BUSINESS
