



SCHEDULE OF SHOWS 2019

HELPFUL TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS

Read the Schedule carefully: exhibits may be disqualified if the judges consider those are 'Not as Schedule' (NAS) – see Rule 6. Allow plenty of time on the day for staging.

Spend time and care over general presentation – when the competition is tough, good presentation can be the deciding factor. *Presentation to be viewed from the front* means just that! And *pot* means a regular round garden pot, not another type of container.

Uniformity is more important than size. Try to show the items that are as uniform as possible in size, form and colour.

Wash all vegetable roots with clean water – do NOT scrub!

POTATOES – choose medium size for the variety. Look for a good shape with no blemishes.

RUNNER BEANS/BROAD BEANS – display across a plate with all stalks facing one way and tails the other.

SHALLOTS/ONIONS – should have tops tied down and roots trimmed. Can be displayed on collars or rings or sand.

CABBAGE/CAULIFLOWER/LETTUCE – leave 3" (7.5cm) of stalk.

TOMATOES – arrange with calyx facing upwards. Fruits should be of an even size and good shape with no marks or unripe areas.

CHRYSANTHEMUMS AND DAHLEAS – display with leaves on the stem.

BEETROOT/CARROTS/PARSNIPS – leave 3" (7.5cm) of leaf stalk and tie neatly.

FRUIT – never polish – keep the natural 'bloom'. Leave stalks ON and display with the stalk facing downwards.

ROSES – look for cleanliness, colour intensity and good shape. Foliage should be well formed and free of blemishes, diseases and pests.

POT PLANTS – a sturdy, shapely plant – preference will be given to decorative rather than botanical value. Make sure the pot is clean!

When labelling exhibits write clearly in BLOCK LETTERS. Show cards will be available at the time of staging.

Any questions – ask the Show Secretary or a Committee Member.

SHOW RULES

1. Except for the 'Floral Arrangement' classes all other classes are "Open"
Entry fees are 50p per entry with a maximum entry fee of £5 and 75p for late entries. Junior classes in the Autumn Show are free.
2. All exhibitors must be amateur i.e. have not practised as nurseryman, florist, seedsman or professional gardener, nor earn their livelihood at gardening or issuing a list or catalogue of plants for sale.
3. With the exception of Classes 101 to 104, and the Domestic Section, exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been grown from seed by the exhibitor or have been in his/her possession for two months prior to the Show.
4. Novice Classes are restricted to any exhibitor who, at the time of submitting his/her Entry Form, has not won a first prize in a similar Class.
5. No exhibitor may stage more than one exhibit in any one Class, except in sections B, C and D.
6. Every exhibit must bear an Official Class Card which will be obtainable from the Show Secretary at the time of staging, and exhibitors will be responsible for the correct placing of these cards and for the accuracy of the particulars.
7. Any exhibit which does not conform to the wording of the Schedule shall be disqualified. Wherever possible the variety of the exhibit should be named, but omission to do so will not cause disqualification.
8. Unless otherwise stated, in all Classes which require the receptacle to be a vase, exhibitors will use the vase provided.
9. Unless otherwise stated, exhibits will be judged in accordance with the Rules and Standards contained in the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook. The decision of the Judge will be final as to the relative merits of the exhibit. If, in the opinion of the Judge, an exhibit is unworthy of the prize offered, it may be withdrawn or modified.
10. The RHS Rules require that should two exhibitors tie for the Banksian Medal, the first in alphabetical order should receive the medal, unless he/she has already won a Banksian Medal and the other has not. In all other cases of a tie the above principle will apply and the award made to the first in alphabetical order. The winner of the medal in 2018 is not eligible for the award this year.

11. In order to promote greater competition, exhibitors who have won the following trophies or awards in 2018 will not be eligible to win those again, in **2019**: The Society Shield and the Carnegie Cup. Those trophies and awards will be awarded to other exhibitors in the relevant classes (if any).
12. Between the time fixed for a completion of staging and the presentation of awards, no exhibit may be altered or removed except by the permission of the Show Secretary.
13. There will be no facilities for storage of private property left during the Show. All exhibits, personal property, etc., shall be left at the risk of the owner and must be removed immediately after the closure of the Show. The Society shall not be liable for damage or compensation from any cause whatsoever.
14. Any matters connected with the Show which are not expressly covered by these rules will be dealt with by the Show Committee, and their decision will be final. The Committee reserve the right to refuse an entry or entrants without obligation to give a reason for so doing.
15. All Cups & Trophies remain the property of the MHS and are held by the winners for one year. Cups and Trophies for the Autumn Show should be returned by 31 July each year.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES **SECTION A – FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS**

To celebrate Mottingham Floral Arrangement Club Diamond anniversary

Class

- 101 **“DIAMONDS ARE A GIRL’S BEST FRIEND”** - a design to depict the title to be viewed from the front. Space 69cm x 69cm.
- 102 **“SOMETHING OLD, SOMETHING NEW”** - a design to depict the title to be viewed from the front. Space 69cm x 69cm.
- 103 **“A LITTLE BIT OF SPARKLE”** - petite – an exhibit depicting the title to be viewed from the front.
Space: more than 10cm X 10cm but not exceed 22.5cm x 22.5cm.

NOVICE CLASS

- 104 **“PRECIOUS LITTLE”** - a design to depict the title to be viewed from the front. Space 60cm x 60cm.

Notes

All exhibits are for viewing from the front.

All the above Classes may be arranged BEFORE the show.

Judging will NOT be by NAFAS rules.

Backing and bases are to be supplied by the exhibitor.

SECTION B – EARLY FLOWERING CHRYSANTHEMUMS

(To be judged in accordance with NCS Rules)
MULTIPLE ENTRIES PERMITTED:– SEE RULE 4.

Class

- 105 **SPECIMEN BLOOM or 1 STEM OF SPRAYS – ANY VARIETY.**
- 106 **LARGE** – three blooms – any variety.
- 107 **SPRAY (EXHIBITION or NATURAL)** – 3 stems – one or more varieties.
- 108 **VASE OF MIXED BLOOMS or SPRAYS** – 3 to 6 stems – more than one variety.
- 109 **NOVICE** –1 bloom – any variety – or 3 stems of single blooms or spray – one or more varieties.

Note:

ALL CLASSES ARE OPEN.

SECTION C – DAHLIAS

(To be judged in accordance with NDS Rules)

MULTIPLE ENTRIES PERMITTED:– SEE RULE 4.

DAHLIA SIZES

GIANT – over 250mm (10")

LARGE – 200–250mm (8" to 9")

MEDIUM – 150–200mm (6" to 8")

SMALL – 100–150mm (4" to 6")

MINIATURE – up to 100mm (4")

POMPON – not over 50mm (2")

Class

- 110 GIANT or LARGE** – 1 bloom any variety.
- 111 MEDIUM DECORATIVE/CACTUS or SEMI CACTUS** – 3 blooms, one or more varieties.
- 112 SMALL or MINIATURE** – 3 blooms, one or more varieties.
- 113 POMPOM** – 5 blooms, one or more varieties.
- 114 A VASE OF MIXED BLOOMS** – any variety – any size – any number.
- 115 NOVICE CLASS** – 3 blooms – one or more varieties – any size.

Note:

ALL CLASSES ARE OPEN.

SECTION D – GLADIOLI

(To be judged in accordance with BGS Rules)
MULTIPLE ENTRIES PERMITTED:– SEE RULE 4.

Class

- 116. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 3 spikes, 1 spike to a vase, 1 or more varieties.
- 117. **MEDIUM or SMALL FLOWERED** – 2 spikes in one vase, one variety only.
- 118. **TWO SPIKES** – in one vase, any size, 1 or more varieties.
- 119. **NOVICE CLASS** – 2 spikes in one vase, 1 or more varieties.

Note:

ALL CLASSES ARE OPEN.

SECTION E – ROSES

Class

- 120. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 1 stem.
- 121. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 2 stems, one or more varieties.
- 122. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 1 fully open bloom, stamens to show.
- 123. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 1 stem (to be judged for fragrance only).
- 124. **CLUSTER FLOWERED** – 1 stem, any variety.
- 125. **MINIATURE – LARGE FLOWERED** – 1 stem, any variety, own container.
- 126. **MINIATURE – CLUSTER FLOWERED** – 1 stem, any variety, own container.

NOVICE CLASSES

Class

- 127. **LARGE FLOWERED** – 2 stems, any variety.

SECTION F – VARIOUS FLORALS

Class

- 128. **ANNUALS** – 1 vase of blooms not otherwise named in the schedule, 1 or more varieties.
- 129A. **PERENNIALS** – 1 vase of blooms, not more than 3 kinds.
- 129B. **PERENNIAL** – 1 specimen, garden perennial in a vase..
- 130. **MIXED GARDEN FLOWERS** – 1 vase, not less than 3 kinds.
- 131. **FOLIAGE** – 1 vase – maximum of 6 kinds.
- 132. **DRIED MATERIALS** – 1 vase (must be home grown).
- 133. **SPECIMEN POT PLANT** – in open bloom – grown by the exhibitor.
- 134. **SPECIMEN FOLIAGE POT PLANT** – grown by the exhibitor.
- 135. **SPECIMEN CACTUS or SUCCULENT POT PLANT** – grown by the exhibitor.
- 136. **SPECIMEN SINGLE POT PLANT** – in bloom – grown by the exhibitor.
Pot size over 20cm (will be staged on the floor).
- 137. **SPECIMEN FOLIAGE POT PLANT** – grown by the exhibitor.
Pot size over 20cm (will be staged on the floor).

(Unless otherwise stated the maximum size of pots is 20cm in diameter measured across the top from the inside edges).

SECTION G – FRUIT & VEGETABLES

Class

138. **APPLES** – dessert, 3 of one variety.
139. **APPLES** – cooking, 3 of one variety.
140. **BLACKBERRIES** (including hybrids) –18 with stalks.
141. **RASPBERRIES** – 18 with stalks.
142. **PEARS WITH STALKS** – 3 of one variety.
143. **PLATE OF FRUIT WITH STALKS** – not otherwise named in the schedule, one variety only.
144. **TOMATOES** (any variety) – indoor or outdoor grown, 5 with stalks.
145. **TOMATOES** (cherry type) –10 with stalks, (indoor or outdoor).
146. **RUNNER BEANS** – 9 pods.
147. **ONIONS** – 3, over 225gm, dressed.
148. **ONIONS** – 5, 225gm or under, dressed.
149. **POTATOES** (any variety) – 5 of one variety.
150. **CARROTS** – 3 of one variety.
151. **BEETROOT** – 3 globes with 5cm – 7.5cm stalks.
152. **CABBAGE** – 2 with roots.
153. **VASE OF HERBS** – an arrangement of herbs not less than 3 and not more than 5 kinds.
154. **MARROW** – a pair, not to exceed 30cm in length.
155. **SHALLOTS** – 9 of one variety – tied and on a plate (sand optional).
156. **VEGETABLES** – an exhibit of vegetables not otherwise named in the schedule, one variety only. Numbers, not less than 3, at the discretion of the exhibitor.
157. **COLLECTION OF SALAD VEGETABLES** – not less than 3 kinds in an area 60cm x 60cm, (numbers in the exhibit at the discretion of the exhibitor).
158. **COLLECTION OF VEGETABLES** – not less than 3 kinds in an area 60cm x 60cm, (numbers in the exhibit at the discretion of the exhibitor)

SECTION H – DOMESTIC

Class

- 159. **JAM/JELLY/CONSERVE or CHEESE** – soft fruit, home made 225gm – 450gm jar.
- 160. **JAM/JELLY/CONSERVE or CHEESE** – stone fruit, home made 225gm – 450gm jar.
- 161. **MARMALADE** – fresh citrus fruit, home-made 225gm–450gm jar.
- 162. **CHUTNEY** – home-made 225gm–450gm jar.
- 163. **PICKLE** – a jar of pickled fruit or vegetable, home made 225gm–450gm jar.
- 164. **EMBROIDERY** – complete piece, hand worked.
- 165. **EMBROIDERY – CROSS STITCH** – complete piece, hand worked.
- 166. **KNITTING or CROCHET** – complete piece, hand worked.
- 167. **BREAD** – loaf, white or brown, fresh or dried yeast, 450 gm weight
- 168. **FRUIT CAKE** – 20cm in diameter.
- 169A. **DECORATED CAKE** – homemade decorated cake, floral theme up to 20cm diameter – iced, marzipan or sugarcraft
- 169B. **THREE DECORATED HOMEMADE CUPCAKES.**
- 170. **SANDWICH CAKE** – 20cm in diameter.
- 171. **PLAIN SCONES** – 5, made to own recipe.
- 172. **SAVORY or FRUIT FLAN** – up to 22.5cm diameter – made to own recipe.
- 173. **WINE/BEER or LIQUEUR** – 1 bottle – home-made from roots/vegetables/fruit/flowers or fruit concentrate.
- 174. **PAINTING/DRAWING/SKETCH or COLLAGE** – depicting horticulture size not to exceed 45cm square.
- 175. **PHOTOGRAPH** – a photograph depicting horticulture – size not to exceed 45cm square.

Entries in Classes 164, 165, 166, 174 and 175 are not to have previously been exhibited at one of the Society's Shows.

SECTION I – NOVELTIES

- 176. **ONION – SINGLE SPECIMEN** – to be judged by weight alone.
- 177. **MARROW – SINGLE SPECIMEN** – to be judged by weight alone.
- 178. **PUMPKIN or SQUASH – SINGLE SPECIMEN** – to be judged by weight alone.
- 179. **TOMATO – SINGLE SPECIMEN** – to be judged by weight alone.
- 180. **RUNNER BEAN – SINGLE SPECIMEN** – to be judged by length alone.
- 181. **CARROT** - to be judged by length alone.
- 182. **SUNFLOWER – SINGLE BLOOM** – to be judged by diameter of seed head.
- 183. **VEGETABLE – MOST UNUSUAL SHAPE.**

JUNIOR CLASSES – 15 YEARS AND UNDER

- 184. **GARDEN FLOWERS** – a vase.
- 185. **GREETINGS CARD** – horticultural theme – any materials.
- 186. **FRUIT** – 3 or more, any varieties, 45cm x 45 cm
- 187. **VEGETABLES** – 3 or more, any varieties, 45cm x 45 cm

A.R. FORRESTER CHALLENGE TROPHY to the member gaining the highest aggregate of points in all classes in Section B.

REGENT CUP donated by Mr L Hubbard, for the best vase of chrysanthemums in Section B.

ASHBY CUP presented by F. Ashby, Esq., to the winner of class 109.

ELMHURST CUP presented by the late Mr S P Bearsby, awarded to the member gaining the highest aggregate of points in all classes in Section C.

KINGSMEAD CUP presented by the late Mr E H Rowe, to the winner of class 115.

BGS RIBBON AWARD for the best exhibit by a member in Section D.

GLADIOLUS TROPHY presented by Mr R Vander, for the highest aggregate of points gained by a member in Section D.

FT. HUNT MEMORIAL BOWL to the member gaining the highest aggregate of points in all classes in Sections E, F and G.
