

## Council Tax rebate 'We won't call you'

**Bromley Trading Standards** wants to remind Bromley residents that they will **NOT** receive a telephone call regarding the Council Tax rebate that is currently due to qualifying residents in property bands A-D.

Scammers have been contacting households by phone asking for bank details in order to process the £150 rebate. They may claim to be calling from or on behalf of the Council but this is not true.

Those who have fallen for this scam have reported large sums of money being deducted from their bank account shortly after the call. There have also been fake emails and text messages. [Watch out for this energy rebate council tax scam – Which? News](#)

If you pay your Council Tax by direct debit you will receive the rebate directly into your bank account. If bank details are not held by the Council, a letter will be sent inviting residents to complete an online application, where they can enter their bank details.

If you receive **any** unexpected telephone calls **HANG UP immediately**

You can then make enquiries with the organisation they claimed to be from via a trusted number that you select.
